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Introduction: Provide a brief overview of the background and the rationale for the study. Clearly state the research problem, objective, or purpose of the study. **Methods:** Describe the study design and methods used. For original research, include setting, participants, procedures, data collection, and statistical analysis. For systematic reviews/meta-analyses, include data sources, search strategy, and selection criteria. For case reports, briefly describe the patient presentation, diagnostic evaluation, intervention or management, and follow-up. **Results:** Present the principal findings in a clear and concise manner. Provide sufficient data to allow reviewers and readers to evaluate the outcomes. For reviews/meta-analyses, summarize the main findings of the included studies. Vague statements such as “the results will be discussed” should be avoided. **Conclusions:** Summarize the key findings and highlight their significance. Emphasize the implications for clinical practice, future research, or community health.

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
